Green Wedmore – multiple projects around energy, transport, food, wellbeing, carbon and nature.


Wedmore CPC – 1MW nonprofit community owned solar farm - £600k community fund

Some COP26 Outcomes and some focus/thinking points

- Virtually 100% of carbon sequestration is done by nature. We need to boost that capacity.
- We have to stop exploitation of carbon as quickly as possible – in Somerset, stop digging peat!
- Protect and restore other natural areas doing an amazing climate job, saltmarshes, mudflats, woodlands
- To stay below 1.5oC, the world needs to reduce emissions by 45% (on 2010 levels) by 2030.
 Currently due to increase by 2030, plus 1.5 will still be devastating.
- Climate Adaptation featured more at COP26 this aspect is key for Sedgemoor (on climates front line) – links with resilience – Adaptation Pathways in Somerset – Adapting the Levels
- Tech aspects we have all the tech we need no need, no time, no money for big tech e.g. small modular reactors – HPD!
